Randy Wayne White's Everglades — Writing the REAL Florida Museum of the Everglades | January 14 – May 3

Best-selling South Florida author Randy Wayne White spent 13 years as a full-time fishing guide out of Tarpon Bay on nearby Sanibel Island. He had run over 3,000 paid charters ranging from Fort Myers to Flamingo when government regulations closed the bay he guided from to motorized craft. With a wife and two young sons to support and his livelihood in jeopardy, he set out to write the great American novel – and succeeded. It was 1989.

Combining his passion for Florida history with his knowledge of coastal waters, the local culture and experience with the people and places that

make the region so unique, Mr. White created a protagonist for his story – Marion “Doc” Ford. A former national security agent turned marine biologist who was simultaneously relatable, likeable, and still deadly when necessary. 27 books later, the Doc Ford series is still going strong.

The action in Randy Wayne White’s books crisscrosses the state (and sometimes the globe) but the Everglades remain at the heart of many of his stories. Many readers recognize locations described in the novels and often see local personalities reflected in the books’ characters. New visitors to the area have already learned about the challenges facing what remains of “old Florida” through Mr. White’s writings when they arrive and immediately feel connections with both the people and the land.

Our new temporary exhibit, Randy Wayne White’s Everglades, celebrates and explores those connections and the author whose work brings the REAL Florida to life.



Memories of Collier County through the Art of Phil Fisher Collier Museum at Government Center | February 1 – April 30

Phil Fisher says, “I like to think of my paintings as a sanctuary for those who feel anesthetized by technology.” Phil has been painting in Naples, in watercolors and oils, for the past 53 years. The majority of his work is done “plein air” so he has a visual preference for landscapes. This exhibit will feature Phil’s paintings of beloved Naples locations, as well as commissions now part of the Collier County Museum collection.

The Florida House: Marco Island's Mackle-built Model Homes

Marco Island Historical Museum | February 25 – June 7

This exhibit delves into the fascinating history behind Marco Island's Mackle-built model homes, which can be traced back to the post-World War II "Florida House" crafted by builders and developers hoping to entice Northerners to the Sunshine State. Constructed during the modern development of Marco Island by the Deltona Corporation from 1965 through the 1970s, these 72 diverse models were designed, inside and out, to embody the elegant tropical living the Mackle Brothers envisioned for the "crown jewel" of their planned communities.

This presentation covers centuries of Florida's cattle ranching history, starting with the introduction of cattle and horses in the 16th century by the Spanish. Bob Stone illuminates themes of cultural identity, customs, and beliefs in this presentation that shows audiences that cattle ranching is not just a business, but a way of life and complete culture.

The Amazing Architecture of Northeast Florida by Wayne Wood | March 27

Northeast Florida has a rich and diverse collection of architectural gems. This illustrated program provides an in-depth survey of the most significant landmarks as well as many remarkable hidden jewels worthy of acclaim through three and a half centuries of architectural history in St. Augustine, Jacksonville, Fernandina, and more.

Widely regarded as one of the foremost chronicles of Northeast Florida history, Wayne Wood has been called the undisputed godfather of preservation in Jacksonville. An author, historian, and artist, he founded Riverside Avondale Preservation and Riverside Arts Market. He has published 15 books on Northeast Florida, including Jacksonville's Architectural Heritage.


Artist's Gallery Talk — Phil Fisher | February 11

Phil Fisher is one of the area's most recognized and popular impressionist artists, as he has been living and painting here for over 53 years. He has pursued his interest in art and nature since childhood, and has sacrificed what was needed to be an artist. He portrays visual interpretations of familiar landscapes with life happening. He studied formally at the University of Toledo, Ohio, The Toledo Museum of Art, Ringling School of Art in Sarasota and the Instituto D'Allende in San Miguel, Mexico. His paintings have been in many national and international exhibitions and garnered awards. His list of commissions include several large oils for the Collier County

Museum, book illustrations, magazine covers and artwork for fundraising events for charitable groups. Join Phil as he discusses his life as an artist, his philosophy toward art, and the works on display in his current exhibition.




A Painting, a Panther, and a Passion | April 8



In this "artifact spotlight" Museum Director Amanda Townsend will explore the history behind Phil Fisher's large-scale oil painting of Jim McMullen's beloved panther, Tracker. A gift to the museum from William Payne in 1996, the painting is an entrance to the fascinating story of Jim and Phil and their efforts to save the Florida panther at a time when biologists estimated less than 30 of the big cats remained in the wild.

Across the Literary Landscape — An Overview of Books Inspired by the Everglades and the People Who Wrote Them | February 20

Join us for the February edition of our Third Thursday lectures as Museum Manager Thomas Lockyear discusses everything from best-selling action novels to nearly-unknown non-fiction treatises that share the Everglades as a common theme. From Marjory Stoneman Douglas to Peter Mathiessen, Carl Hiaasen to Lauren "Totch" Brown, Mr. Lockyear will explore the way the Everglades have been used as a backdrop, a

setting, a subject, and even a character by authors in every genre imaginable for well over a century. Along with touching on the works of Randy Wayne White, the subject of the Museum's current temporary exhibit, the talk will also highlight books by local authors and even an array of Everglades-themed children's books.

Driving Passion — The Collier Family and their Cars | March 20

County founder Barron Collier's involvement in the construction of the Tamiami Trail, making it possible for the growing number of Florida visitors to explore the Everglades region by car, is common knowledge. However, many remain unaware that his family's love affair with the automobile extends well beyond its utility as transportation for tourists. Mr. Collier himself was deeply involved in all aspects of traffic safety, even authoring a book entitled *Stopping Street Accidents*, and his sons became avid auto-racers, building hotrods and establishing one of the earliest and most elite racing clubs in the country. This talk will explore all aspects of the Colliers' relationship with cars, culminating with the remarkable collection amassed by grandson Miles Collier and his creation of the Revs Institute to not only house more than a hundred vintage vehicles and scores of artifacts, but to "deepen the understanding and appreciation of automotive history."

By Boat, By Train, By Car, By Plane — A Brief History of the Everglades City Airport | April 17

Museum Manager Thomas Lockyear will discuss the evolution of the Everglades Airpark from a short, private airstrip used exclusively by Barron Collier's sons to its present-day incarnation as a 29-acre public facility bringing an influx of over \$2 million annually into the local economy. The role of airplanes in the region's unique culture will be discussed in detail — from the fledgling flights of Collier County's first airborne law enforcement officer, William Riley "Clyde" Maynard (known as the "Flying Sheriff"), to site-seeing excursions and the involvement of stolen aircraft in illegal trades of the 1980s.


Get Growing | March 12
